**Operating Policy and Procedure** 

# HSCEP OP: 75.12, TTUHSC EI Paso Guidelines for medical use of N-95 Respirators

- **PURPOSE:** The purpose of this Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center El Paso (TTUHSC El Paso) Operating Policy and Procedure (HSCEP OP) is to provide guidance in the voluntary use of N-95 respirators and to promote compliance with U.S. Department of Health and Human Services and Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) guidelines supporting the use of N-95 respirators for protection from various diseases and infections environments.
- **REVIEW:** This HSCEP OP will be reviewed by September 1 of each even-numbered year (ENY) by the director of Safety Services, the chair of the Infection Control Committee., with recommendations for revisions forwarded to the dean of the School of Medicine or designee by September 15.

#### **DEFINITIONS:**

Administrator – Safety Services Senior Director responsible for overall program.

**Coordinator** – Designated staff member responsible for the coordination of the N-95 fit testing.

**Supervisor** – Staff member responsible for the oversite of designated employees and or staff members.

Visitor – An individual who is on campus for two weeks or less.

### POLICY/PROCEDURE:

- I. Administration.
  - A. The medical respiratory testing program administrator (known hereafter as the Administrator, Senior Safety Services Director) will be responsible for the overall administration of the program under the supervision of the TTUHSC El Paso Infection Control Committee.
  - B. Prior to being tested for medical use of an N-95 respirator, please comply with The Office of Occupational Health Medical Evaluation Questionnaire for use of N-95 Respirator.
  - C. Original copies of records will be forwarded to the appropriate personnel and maintained as needed by each office.

### II. Recommended Uses.

A. In some circumstances, the use of N-95 respirators is recommended for the following diseases and conditions:

Airborne Isolation Precautions Animal Carcass Handlers

Hantaviruses

Severe Acute Respiratory

Anthrax Autopsy Personnel Avian Influenza Bird Flu Blastomycosis Coccidioidmycosis Dental Health Care Personnel (DHCP) Histoplasmosis Influenza A (H5N1) Measles (Rubeola) Microbiology Work Mold Remediation Monkeypox Pathology Work Syndrome (SARS) Smallpox

Tuberculosis Varicella (Chicken Pox) Viral Hemorrhagic Fevers (VHF) Working with Stool Specimens Respiratory Secretions Work

B. Consult the manufacturer's recommendations and guidelines for proper use of the specific respirator selected.

## III. Applicable Personnel.

- A. Applicable personnel are defined as those who have access to N-95 respirators for the purpose of reducing personal exposure to the diseases and conditions listed above.
- B. This policy applies to the following TTUHSC El Paso personnel, as a minimum
  - 1) All TTUHSC El Paso employees;
  - 2) All TTUHSC EL Paso students working on an academic assignment
  - 3) All TTUHSC El Paso residents;
  - 4) All TTUHSC El Paso volunteers whose duties require associating with or are reasonably anticipated to have contact with any of the above diseases or conditions.
- C. This policy also applies to the following TTUHSC EI Paso worksite locations, as a minimum:
  - (1) TTUHSC El Paso facilities, including leased facilities;
  - (2) Medical Clinics, Faculty, Residents, Staff, Students and Visitors
- D. Personnel to whom this policy is applicable include those who are assigned duties where the use of N-95 respirators or the use of other types of respirators or personal protection equipment (PPE) is mandatory, including contractors.

### IV. Responsibilities.

- A. Where conditions exist for occupational exposure to the diseases and conditions identified under section 2 above, N-95 respirators should be made available to personnel to reduce the risk of exposure. The department supervisor or administrator will ensure the applicant has completed Attachment A, Respiratory Evaluation Questionnaire, and forward as appropriate.
- B. TTUHSC EI Paso Safety Services will provide N-95 respirator instructions during fit testing. Attachment B, Qualitative Fit Test Record, will be used to record fit test results.
- C. Each TTUHSC El Paso department providing N-95 respirators shall provide respirators that are NIOSH certified and suitable for the purpose intended.
- D. TTUHSC EI Paso department administrators are responsible for identifying applicable personnel who require access to N-95 respirators in relation to their assigned duties, and directing those personnel to the appropriate administrator/coordinator for training,

respiratory evaluation questionnaire and fit testing.

- E. Coordinators are responsible for ensuring that personnel identified by the department administrator have completed the medical evaluation questionnaire, the online training video, then sent to Safety Services for fit testing. The Office of Occupational Health will provide Safety Services documentation of acknowledgment of completion of their medical evaluation to the administrator.
- F. The Office of Occupational Health will maintain all health-related evaluations in the Texas Tech Health Manager system and send out respiratory evaluation questionnaires as needed.
- G. The administrator is responsible for providing instruction on fit testing, monitoring respirator use, and evaluating the effectiveness of the program at least annually.
- H. Supervisors and users of N-95 respirators in each applicable TTUHSC EI Paso department will be responsible for following this HSCEP OP and guidance provided by the coordinators and administrator.
